#### **Supreme Court Makes Decision**

The Florida Attorney General Pam Bondi has stated that 'Court has spoken' on gay marriage. Ms. Bondi defended the state against lawsuits aimed at upending a ban on same-sex marriage that had been approved by Florida. Bondi added it is time to accept the outcome.

She said the Supreme Court's decision "provided the clarity our state and country was seeking." Bondi also said legal efforts were not about personal beliefs or opinions, but rather, "the rule of law."

A federal judge ruled last year that Florida's voterapproved ban is unconstitutional. U.S. District Judge Robert Hinkle stayed the effect of his ruling until Jan. 5. Same sex couples started getting married throughout the state on that date.

# Important Notice for all Williamsburg Residents and Martin County ...

Martin County Utilities will temporarily change our method of chlorinating potable water to insure the future safety of the-water. The-Utility water users may notice an unusual chlorine taste or odor in their tap water during the period of July 5, 2015 - July 18, 2015.

These temporary conditions will not be harmful to your health; however, if you are on kidney dialysis you should consult your physician for special instructions concerning this matter. If you have tropical fish or aquatic animals, you should contact your local tropical fish store for advice and take appropriate action to insure that you have properly treated the water before adding it your aquarium.

The hydrant flushing during this period may cause the water to become cloudy and discolored. This is a temporary condition and should not last more than a few hours.

We sincerely regret any inconvenience you may experience during this time. Please keep in mind that this is necessary to provide safe water for our customers.

#### Concerning News from Ft. Pierce ...

Florida's only invasive plant species quarantine facility could close following Gov. Rick Scott's budget cuts, University of Florida officials said Wednesday.

Jack Payne, senior vice president for Agriculture and Natural Resources at UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences said funding cuts to the quarantine center at the Indian River Research and Education Center in Fort Pierce make it likely the program will end.

The legislature had approved a \$180,000 increase — the first since 2004, but Scott cut all funding, \$720,000 for the quarantine facility.

Florida has the largest invasive infestations in the nation, and the invasives cost the state approximately \$100 million a year, Payne said.

The center was poised to release the first biological control agent against the Brazilian peppertree, which has infested nearly 700,000 acres in Central and South Florida. The trees take over space where native plants should be. Animals such as white-tailed deer, the Florida panther and migratory birds that depend on native vegetation, such as mangrove, for food and shelter, are deprived of that habitat.

In addition, UF/IFAS lost \$300,000 that funds a Water Pollution Study, which looks at the impact of street sweepers on the pollution that runs into storm drains. And, the institute lost \$2.5 million for a state of the art honeybee research center.

"We will continue to do great work at UF/IFAS, and look forward to working with the governor during the next session to pursue funding for those programs that were not approved," Payne said.
